



Camp Sunshine Sand Castle World's Tallest According to Guinness

According to Guinness World Records, Camp Sunshine and Ed Jarrett of Falmouth, Maine now hold the new record for the World's Tallest Sandcastle. Measured at 31.70 ft the sand castle created by Jarrett as part of the Castle to the Sun fundraiser to benefit Camp Sunshine is located at Point Sebago Resort in Casco, ME. The announcement puts to rest the recent claim made by Myrtle Beach, SC that the castle they had constructed was the tallest.

"I am thrilled for Camp Sunshine and the thousands of volunteers that poured their hearts into this project. Everyone helped along the way, we had 8 year-old kids from local summer camps, Point Sebago Resort guests, local citizens, and Camp Sunshine families construct this castle. The sense of community that this project displayed was incredible, and it's for them that I'm pleased the confusion has been cleared up as to who holds the new Guinness World Record."
